

Community Science at Token Creek Conservancy **BAT WALK**

Did you know that one out of every five mammal species on earth is a BAT?! Wisconsin is a hotspot for little brown bats and home to eight species of these incredible predators of insects. Our local bats eat up to 24 crop pests and 17 types of mosquitoes.

Join us to become a backyard bat “detective” – walking conservancy trails after dark to uncover the mysteries of local night life. Learn how to use bat detectors that plug into your (USB-C compatible) smart device to listen to and identify wild bats in real time. Guided by a **Bat Biologist & Bat Educator** from the **WI Department of Natural Resources Bat Program** we will gather data that will benefit conservancy caretakers.
